Community Information Session Hills of Gold Wind Farm

Wind Energy Partners is proposing a large scale wind farm known as the Hills of Gold Wind Farm, located 8 km south east of Nundle.

The project involves:

construction and operation of a large scale wind farm with up to 98 wind turbines each of 220 metres in height; and

associated infrastructure including substations, a permanent operations and maintenance building, access roads, overhead transmission lines, concrete batching plant and temporary construction compounds and battery storage.

Due to the nature and scale of the wind farm, it would be classified as 'State Significant Development' under the Environmental Planning and Assessment Act 1979. This means that the consent authority for the proposal would be the NSW Minister for Planning or the Independent Planning Commission, rather than the local council.

The Department will be holding a community information session to listen to any concerns that the local community may have about the project and assist local residents to better understand the assessment process for the project:

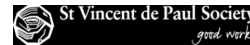

As part of its drought relief package initiative, Council at its meeting of 14 August 2018 resolved to make available free water to farmers impacted by the drought at all of Councils water supplies – Attunga, Barraba, Bendemeer, Kootingal, Manilla, Nundle and Tamworth.

The metered standpipes are ideally suited to filling small tanks up to 1,000 litres and it will not be possible to fill water carts from the standpipes.
