Access to Community Defibrillators Nundle & Hanging Rock

It is always important to remember that in an emergency please dial 000. The 000 call centre will dispatch the local SES/ Community First Responders. The unit has on hand a defibrillator and appropriate oxygen equipment.

There is also a defibrillator available for public access at the office of the Fossickers Tourist Park Nundle (caravan park office). There is a 24 hour emergency access buzzer near the front door of the office. Should you require access to the defibrillator at any time the office is unattended or after office hours, please press the 24 hour emergency access buzzer and a staff member will be available to assist you.

At Hanging Rock there is a defibrillator located at the Hanging Rock Community Hall on the external wall, near the main entry doors to the hall.

There is also a defibrillator located at the Nundle Swimming Pool. Whilst Council has no objection to the community borrowing the item to respond to an emergency, it must be noted that the consequence of such is Council must then close the pool for the safety of patrons and cannot re-open the pool until the equipment is returned to the pool. To avoid the impact of closing the pool on the community, please give consideration to not borrowing the pool equipment as the first option.

Please remember in an Emergency dial 000.

Level 4 Water Restrictions from 28th January 2019

- All residential outdoor use of treated / town / Council water is now banned.
- Council will cease to irrigate public parks, gardens, roundabouts and sporting facilities with treated water, but bore / groundwater can continue to be used where available.
- Recycled, greywater and rainwater can be used. If you believe use of these supplies will be misperceived by neighbours or passersby, Council can inspect the system and provide signage for its use.
- Trickle feed tanks that are connected to the town water supply for refilling <u>cannot</u> be used for outdoor watering.
- There is no irrigation of outdoor industrial and commercial green spaces.
- Cleaning of vehicle windows, windscreens and mirrors can be done for safety purposes with <u>buckets only</u>.
- Pools cannot be filled or topped up.
- The current Drought Relief Filling Station will be turned off and will not be available until further notice
